Community Foundation's *Give Local St. Joseph County Day* **Slated for May 5, 2015**

Food Bank of Northern Indiana to Participate in this 24-Hour Giving Event


The Community Foundation of St. Joseph County will host *Give Local St. Joseph County*, a one-day giving event on Tuesday, May 5. Designed to support the county's best charities now and in the future, *Give Local St. Joseph County* will inspire people to give generously to nonprofits that do good work within the community.

Every dollar donated on May 5 will be increased by a share of an estimated \$3 million dollars in matching funds provided by *Give Local St. Joseph County* sponsors, with the goal of raising a total of \$5 million to benefit local charities. *Give Local St. Joseph County* is tied to a national event on May 5 called Give Local America, which involves scores of community foundations across America.

Because the Community Foundation of St. Joseph County's primary mission is to build permanent resources for the community, *Give Local St. Joseph County* is designed to support local nonprofits both now and forever by passing through 75% of net dollars raised for each charity to support current programming, and by placing the other 25%, in addition to generous matching funds, to each charity's permanent endowment, increasing the annual support it receives each year.

Beginning at 12:00 a.m. and for the next 24 hours, go to GiveLocalSJC.org and use your credit card or debit card to donate to the Food Bank of Northern Indiana. There, you'll find a donation page where you can enter the amount you want to donate to the Food Bank. Donations begin at \$25 and there is no limit to the maximum size or number of donations you may make. You may visit the Leaderboard page for a listing of participating nonprofits, see their gifts in real time and click on their nonprofit title to visit their profile page. Donors will have the opportunity to give to as many different participating non-profits as they like.

There will also be a one-week "preview period" in which donors can schedule a donation for May 5. Donors may also use that preview period to arrange for gifts of stock and make gifts by check.



Donations are 100% tax deductible. Donors have the option to give anonymously on May 5. Technology will enable donors to use their smart phone or tablet to make their donation. If you don't have access to a computer, you may call the Community Foundation of St. Joseph County at 574-232-0041 on May 5 to make a donation by phone. Checks can be dropped off or mailed to the Community Foundation at P.O. Box 837, South Bend, IN 46624, dated May 5, 2015, and postmarked no later than May 5, 2015. Hand-delivered checks must be dropped off by 6 p.m. on May 5 to the Community Foundation office at 205 W. Jefferson, Suite 601, South Bend. Indicate that you would like the Food Bank of Northern Indiana to benefit from your gift. If no indication is made, your gift will be placed in the Greatest Needs Fund.

The Food Bank's long-term vision is to access organizational capacity, celebrate and leverage strengths and to allocate resources more efficiently. Senior Nutrition Program

In 2014, the Food Bank distributed monthly food bags and 149,741 pounds of food to 701 seniors in our six-county service area.

In 2015, we will distribute to 705 seniors. We hope to end the year by adding an additional 25-50 seniors to this program. Funding for the majority of the food distributed through is program is provided by the Indiana Department of Agriculture. You can support a senior in northern Indiana for \$7 per month. Food 4 Kids Fun Packs Program

During the 2014-2015 school year, the Food Bank and its partners are providing 1,800 students in Elkhart, LaPorte, Starke and St. Joseph Counties with a weekend sack of food through its Food 4 Kids Fun Packs Program. Selected schools have students with high eligibility for free/reduced lunch programs. Within each selected school, administrators, teachers and social workers determine which students can participate in the Food 4 Kids Program. We have been humbled by the generous support of the Jordan Automotive Group, who has served as this program's presenting sponsor since 2009. Your investment of \$140 will feed one child for the school year. An investment of \$7,500 will feed approximately 50 children for the school year.
