### 2019 AT A GLANCE

Through its network of 143 active agency partners, the Food Bank of Northern Indiana distributed 8.8 million pounds of food through food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and daycare facilities in Elkhart, Kosciusko, LaPorte, Marshall, Starke, and St. Joseph Counties. In addition, we directly provide food to people in need through our Food 4 Kids Backpack Program, Healthy Choices Market, Senior Nutrition Program, Senior Healthy Choices Market, Mobile Food Pantry Program, Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) and The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP).

- **Pounds Distributed** 8,819,358 lbs. provided up to 6,890,123 meals.
- **Pounds Acquired** 9,405,757 lbs.
- Agency Direct Retail Pick-Up Program Acquired 1,150,431 lbs.
- Food 4 Kids Backpack Program 2,568 students, 99,776 bags, 299,328 lbs., 199,552 meals.
- Senior Nutrition Program 10,182 bags, 141,878 lbs.
- **Healthy Choices Market** Nine classes, 156 clients/45 households, received 792 lbs. of food.
- **Senior Healthy Choices Market** 21 classes, 215 clients/192 households, received 2,462 lbs. of food.
- Commodity Supplemental Food Program 639 clients served through 12 sites in Elkhart, LaPorte, Marshall and St. Joseph Counties, 210,257 lbs. distributed, 212,273 lbs. received
- The Emergency Food Assistance Program 4,432,707 lbs. distributed, 4,621,282 lbs. received.
- **Volunteers** 32,270, 11,316 hours.
- Community Food Pantry of St. Joseph County 20,427 households/90,302 individuals served, 1,634,212 lbs. distributed.


