At a Glance


- The Food Bank distributed **9,518,343 lbs. and received 10,039,492 lbs.** from January December 2023.
- From January December 2023, 190 mobile food distributions served 31,725 households/99,905 individuals and distributed 918,900 lbs. of food the equivalent of up to 717,891 meals in our six-county service area.
- 9,460 volunteers contributed 25,362 volunteer hours.
- 29,381 households/94,016 individuals were served at the Community Food Pantry of St. Joseph County. This pantry distributed 1,458,138 lbs. of food the equivalent of up to 1,139,170 meals.

32nd Annual Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive

Saturday, May 11, 2024

On the second Saturday in May, letter carriers in more than 10,000 communities will collect food donations along their postal routes to restock food banks and pantries during the National Association of Letter Carriers Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive.

Stamp Out Hunger is the nation's largest one-day food drive and the Food Bank of Northern Indiana's largest drive each year.

The Food Bank's 2024 goal is to collect 100,000 lbs. of non-perishable food items to restock its shelves for the summer months when the need is high and food drive donations are typically low.

Businesses are welcome to collect food prior to this drive. The Food Bank can provide collection barrels and will deliver barrels and pick them up. Volunteers are needed to help collect food along postal routes. Please call (574) 232-9986 ext. 129 for more information.

Happy Spring! I look forward to more opportunities to spend time outside during this time of the year — including participating in the NALC Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive. This year's drive takes place on Saturday, May 11. It's easy to participate — grab a few nonperishable food items and put them in a plastic bag by your mailbox by 8 a.m. Your letter carrier will deliver your donation to the Food Bank of Northern Indiana. If you're not going to be home that Saturday, you may deliver your donation to any U.S.P.S. retail center. In St. Joseph County, opportunities are available to assist letter carriers picking up food along their routes.

Now in its 32nd year, Stamp Out Hunger is the nation's largest one-day food drive and the Food Bank's largest food drive each year. Stamp Out Hunger began as outreach into communities by the NALC — these hunger heroes are boots on the ground and saw the face of hunger along their postal routes. If you receive a postcard in the mail, wherever you live, your community is participating in Stamp Out Hunger.

Food collected in your community stays in your community and helps our neighbors. If possible, please donate items with pop-top lids, and healthier items that are low in sugar and sodium. These types of items help neighbors like Ryan create a healthier lifestyle.

The Food Bank's goal is 100,000 lbs. It will help us get through the summer months when the need is high and food donations are low.

MEET RYAN

Ryan has been in and out of shelters since he was a teenager. After graduating high school, he lived out of his car for several months. Occasionally, he would stay with friends and find cheap meals in their cupboards, which was his main source of food at the time

"I don't really have a place to call home exactly.
I am homeless but I have good friends who will
let me crash when I need to."

When Ryan began going to sleep hungry nearly every night, he knew that something had to change.

The Food Bank of Northern Indiana and its network of partner agencies have helped Ryan establish a healthier lifestyle. Pantries and mobile distributions provide fresh ingredients whenever he shops, which is enough for multiple meals. Additionally, low-sodium and low-sugar canned items with pop-top lids are available.

"I know how to make all kinds of meals for myself just from grabbing a few ingredients at the pantry. I feel I have come a long way, and it always surprises my friends that I know how to cook!"

Food 4 Kids Backpack Program

Since 2006, the Food 4 Kids Backpack Program has provided students with a weekend sack of food during the school year and holiday breaks.

The cost is \$150/child for the school year (\$3.75 per week). The Food Bank continues to pilot an enhanced backpack program that provides larger quantities for one group of students. The cost is \$670/student for the school year (\$8 per week). Help us provide the tools to be successful in school and life.

Senior Nutrition Program

Through December 2023, the Senior Nutrition Program served 9,002 seniors who received 210,974 lbs. of food in Elkhart, Kosciusko, LaPorte, Marshall, Starke, and St. Joseph Counties.



An investment of \$18.22 each month ensures that a senior in need of food assistance receives a monthly bag of food.

Pantry Hours:

Lifepoint Church Food Pantry is open Monday through Thursday from 8:30 a.m. – Noon. Neighbors can shop at this pantry once a month. Neighbors are asked to provide a form of I.D. to shop there if possible.



Service Area: Lifepoint Church serves any neighbor in need of food assistance.

The Lifepoint Church Food Pantry is funded through donations designated to the pantry — there is no allocation to fund the pantry in the church budget. Open four mornings each week, LifePoint Church Food Pantry serves anyone — regardless of residency. Their team of volunteers is very welcoming to the neighbors they serve.

It is important for this pantry to include meat with the food box they provide.

They share: "A friend of the pantry, who has been visiting us for many years, is a single mom with three adult children with disabilities. She struggles to make ends meet while trying to keep up with many medical bills. It is life-giving to us to see her on a regular basis and keep up with her story. Her story seems overwhelming, but she continues to put one foot in front of the other, one day at a time, while never giving up. With every box of food we hand to her, we are thankful for the opportunity to be part of her story, provide encouragement to her, and help fill a need."

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

Through December 2023, 3,806 seniors in Elkhart, LaPorte, Marshall, and St. Joseph Counties received 124,238 lbs. of food.

Through December 2023, the Food Bank distributed **9,518,343 lbs.** and received **10,039,492 lbs.** of product. During this period, **2,869,369 lbs.** of government commodities were distributed and **3,175,495 lbs.** were received.

Additionally, our Agency Direct Pick-Up Program received **1,776,268 lbs.** of assorted dry goods and perishable items.
